Combined, all our donors usually provide enough for the families who come to receive as much food as they can use. ### **Promoting Healthy Eating**



The Cape Henlopen Food Basket strives to provide healthy food choices. Our client surveys have told us that having the availability of fresh fruits and vegetables was important to them. We formed a produce committee 2 years ago. This committee of 7 volunteers shops local grocery stores looking for the best prices and quality of produce. We do not limit the amount of produce clients may take at each visit. Our volunteers shop 3 times a week to keep up with the demand. As well, we are grateful to local Farmers' Markets for supporting us with generous in- season produce donations.

# SPOTLIGHT: Frederick L. Doughty



"Hey, is Freddie in today?" This question is asked regularly by CHFB volunteers in need of help, information, or know-how. The Freddie in question is Frederick Lee Doughty, the *go-to guy* for the Cape Henlopen Food Basket (CHFB) and the Community Resource Center (CRC). "Every time somebody needs something, they holler for me," Freddie says. "I'm here."

Freddie has been here with the CHFB and the CRC for about "10 or eleven years, as I recall," he says. Back then, through word of mouth, Freddie found out about a general maintenance job at the CRC. This has evolved into a jack-of-all-trades position for both organizations.

Born into a big family in Exmore, Virginia, Freddie grew up doing farm work. He also worked for a concrete plant in Cape Charles, Virginia and for Perdue in Accomack, Virginia. He is an Eastern Shore guy. He came to Sussex County, Delaware about thirty-five years ago to visit, and he stayed. "I went back home for a little while, but I missed it here so much I came back," he comments. "I like to hang out with the guys." Also, he has family not far away in Newark, Delaware.

Freddie says he's seen lots of changes in his time working here. "People know we're here now and that's a good thing. More people are coming and if they need help, we're here to help them. There's a lot here for them." He works Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. "I enjoy working here," he says. And on his days off? "I work in the yard—work my tomatoes. And sleep!" It's tough duty being the *go-to guy*. *Thank you, Freddie, for all you do!*
